Executive Course

Collaborative leadership in a shared power world

You will reflect on how to overcome barriers and learn how to exercise public leadership to forge more creative and more productive forms of collaborative engagement in a shared power world.

Who is it for?

This course is for not-for-profit leaders who wish to build more collaborative partnerships with the public servants who oversight their grants and contracts. Equally, it is for executives in the public service who want to break down barriers. Corporate leaders who are looking for improved forms of engagement should also attend.

The Focus

Many pressing social problems can only be addressed effectively in a holistic fashion, harnessing the wit, commitment and resources of a range of stakeholders inside government, non-profit and business sectors of society. To actually achieve such an approach is a major leadership challenge, since there are many forces lined up against it, including political divisions, bureaucratic routines and silos, intergovernmental tensions, lack of involvement and/or trust between governmental, corporate and non-profit actors.

This course is designed to help participants reflect on how to overcome these barriers, and how we can harness public leadership in each of these three sectors to forge more creative and more productive forms of collaborative engagement.

Benefits

Leaders from the three sectors will engage with an expert facilitator and with each other to gain insight into how to achieve greater social impact through improved collaborative leadership practice.

Paul 't Hart is professor of political science at ANU and professor of public administration at Utrecht University. He publishes widely on issues of leadership, public administration, and crisis management. As former associate Dean of the Netherlands School of Government, he has taught, trained and consulted with a wide array of Dutch, Swedish, and Australian public agencies, and is the convenor of the Leading Public Sector Change course in the Executive MPA program of the Australia and New Zealand School of Government.
