This is an exciting time for social research in WA. Numerous innovative projects are underway, discovering how children, individuals, families and communities grow and learn, their connections to each other and the wider world, the barriers they face, and the conditions that help them thrive. This conference draws on robust research findings to develop solutions to some of our most pressing social issues – homelessness, poverty, early childhood development, family violence and justice.

We will be using a Human Centred Design process throughout the conference, drawing on robust research and people's lived experiences as a launch pad for creative solutions. Following a disciplined design process from discovery research through to creative ideation, and on to prototype testing, Human Centred Design has provided a replicable method for translating research findings into social policy and practice.
